Lamb residents interested in counseling were offered a new option in October — counseling through Life Counseling Services, an agency with a Christian perspective located in Towamencin, Pa. "We wanted our residents to have another option, especially those who want their therapy to line up with their Christian beliefs," says Donna Mengel, Lamb Foundation president. Lamb residents utilize counseling services and providers throughout Montgomery County.

Jim Schairer, M.Div, MSW, LSW, is available to meet with residents for individual and family counseling. "After being involved with Lamb for just a short time, I love the residents and staff here, and Lamb really does feel like one big family," says Jim.

As an agency that does not receive any government funding, Lamb Foundation continually looks for ways to improve upon the services it offers residents while keeping the costs reasonable. Lamb Foundation seeks to streamline and coordinate medical and mental health services for the convenience of its residents and to reduce the cost of transportation. Restoration of 414 East Walnut Street Continues

With Phase One of the renovation work at 414 East Walnut Street done, Lamb has been able to provide homes to another nine people in need. Now they are focusing on Phase Two, the construction of four new suites, which will provide homes for up to 12 people.

"We are receiving architectural and engineering drawings now, which we'll submit to North Wales Borough for construction permits," says Lamb Foundation President Donna Mengel. While waiting for permits, Lamb staff is able to finish general improvements.

With a waiting list of over a dozen, Lamb is excited that the project will provide safe, affordable, and attrac-

tive homes for up to 21 people.

Dana uses her patience and fine motor skills at Sweet Repeats on Mondays and Fridays to untangle jewelry, sort and pair earrings, swiftly button tiny doll and baby clothes, and comb through clothing pockets before items are sent to be recycled. "It's interesting working there. I like the people and I like that we usually go out to lunch on Fridays," says Dana.

"I have something like a photographic memory, but without seeing the picture first," says Dana. With an increased perception of distances, she quickly memorizes her surroundings so she can easily navigate them. "I used to use a cane, but they can be dangerous, especially outside with cracks in sidewalks," she says. Instead, if she needs assistance, a friend will guide her.

"Dana maneuvers around the store better than those of us with sight," says Donna. "She is truly an inspiration to all of us."

Crafting and relaxing

Arts and crafts projects are one of Dana's favorite pastimes. "I make beads out of clay and my mom pokes holes in the beads so I can then string them onto bracelets. I plan to start making necklaces soon," says Dana.

When she's not working or making beads, Dana likes to relax by reading mysteries in Braille, listening to TV, e-mailing friends, and especially listening to music. "I like going to concerts and like all kinds of music — pop, country, and even oldies."

Goals of travel and concerts

Vacationing in northern California is a favorite memory of Dana's. "I'd like to go back there. I liked being on vacation and shopping for trinkets," she says. Another goal of hers for 2006 is to go to a large concert. "I'd like to hear Sarah McLachlan, or Alisha Keyes."
